The Graduate Certificate of Public Management and Policy

The Political Science Department offers a Graduate Certificate of Public Management and Policy (GCPMP). The GCPMP is a 15-credit program that requires completion of at least 9 credits from a set of core courses and an additional 6 credits in other approved courses. GCPMP students are not required to designate a major professor and establish a graduate committee, because the Director of Graduate Education will approve course selections for each student.

The admissions standards for the GCPMP are the same as for the Master of Arts in Political Science program. Students who complete the GCPMP and apply for admission to the M.A. program may count credits earned for the certificate toward the M.A. degree. Students interested in the certificate program apply through the regular graduate admissions process.
